

TEP Technical Tour

On January 29, members of the ASCE Southern Arizona Branch toured Tucson Electric Power's (TEP) Sundt Power Generating Station on Irvington Road in Tucson. A subsidiary of Fortis, Inc., TEP provides electric service to more than 414,000 customers in southern Arizona, utilizing a mix of fuel sources such as natural gas, coal, wind, solar, and other renewable resources.

Conrad Spencer, TEP's Director of Operations, led a tour of the plant, and gave a brief overview of power generation, transmission, and distribution. The Sundt station last used coal in August 2015 and now relies primarily on natural gas, supplemented by renewable landfill gas and a unique "solar boost" system. While on the tour, ASCE members had a rare opportunity to see one of its turbine units torn down for maintenance.
